The records listed eight trips to Miami with most of the \$8,000 spent on trips to Miami, Dallas, Houston, Washington, San Francisco and the Louisiana State Penitentiary.

Adrian Alba, a garage oper-ator who befriended Oswald here, told reporters he was approached in mid-January by a detective from the DA's office. Alba said the officer questioned him for 30 minutes about Os-wald and he quoted him as saying the interrogation was "Jim Garrison's project."
