## WALLACE SHOT By 2--GARRISON

JUNE Z-TIMES-PIC DA Says 'Major Factors Don't Add Up'

HATTIESBURG, Miss. (AP)

-New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim
Garrison, who directed a
drawn-out probe of the Kennedy assassination, said Friday
he thinks Alabama Gov. George
Wallace was the victim of at
least two gummen.

"There are major factors that don't add up," Garrison said in an interview with WDAM-TV, filmed while he was visiting his mother in Laurel, Miss.

"For example," Garrison said, "(Arthur) Bremer had a gun that fired five shots—a small one, a small gun. We have five wounds in Gov. Wallace and three more wounds in other people, one of the wounds being a major wound in the fleck.

"These were not wounds that

could have gone through Gov. Wallace and into the other people, too."

Wallace was shot while campaigning May 15 in Maryland for the Democratic presidential nomination. He remains paralyzed from the hips down at a hospital in Silver Spring. Bremer, 21, is accused of the shooting.

Garrison, who accused Clay
L. Shaw of conspiring to assassinate President John F.
Kennedy, said is answer to
questions about the Wallace
shooting:

"You have to concede that it is probable that some bullets were fired,

"What was probably done there is what was done before. You have a second shooter with a scope some distance away, and his shooting is covered by the noise in the street."
