RE: Interview of LUIS ORTIZ and EDDIE GUEVARA regarding the location of the Training Camp.

You requested that I attempt to interview LUIS ORTIZ, an attorney (Office - 4011 Magazine Street. Telephone: 899-4986), and EDDIE GUEVARA (233 Chartres Street. Telephone: 522-9761).

LUIS ORTIZ

At 3:00 p.m. I attempted to contact ORTIZ at his office location but learned that he is no longer connected with this law office. This is now the office of Henry Ensenatt. In order to locate ORTIZ I contacted Ed Koch by telephone and as a result he had ORTIZ call me at my home (288-3608) at 4:50 p.m.

ORTIZ told me that there were two Cuban Revolutionary training camps: one located across the lake somewhere between Mandeville and North Shore and one on the lower coast of Algiers. He indicated that he had never been to the camp over the lake, but would attempt to locate information on the site of this camp. The camp in Algiers is supposed to be located at the old Ammunition Depot on the Lower Coast of Algiers. He said that the old barracks were used and are supposed to be still standing.

Ed Koch again called and informed me that he was to see ORTIZ later this evening and that he or ORTIZ would be in touch with me as to further information on the exact locations of both camp sites.

EDDIE GUEVARA

I was unable to contact GUEVARA at his place of business on Chartres Street, which is an Import and Export Company. Ed Koch during one of his telephone conversations with me this evening informed me that he had been in touch with GUEVARA. GUEVARA told Koch that he had never been at either camp, but that the locations could be obtained by viewing films shown on television of the training exercises at the said camps after the invasion of the Bay of Pigs.

Koch informed me that GUEVARA told him that RICARDO DAVIS is somewhere in Texas, but that his father is still in New Orleans.
