On February 27, 1967 I received a call from Tommy Baumler, Attorney at Law, who told me he had information that the owner of Bruning's Seafood Restaurant had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD and JACK RUBY talking together in his place. The conversation seemed to be about their buying a bar or nightclub in this city. This man has given this information to the FBI. Also, Tommy Baumler said that he had heard of a homosexual in the city who had had relationships with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He was attempting to locate this individual for us. Tommy Baumler also said he knew of a girl who was a telephone operator in 1963 who overheard a telephone conversation between JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD. As she recalled it, the call was from New Orleans by JACK RUBY to LEE HARVEY OSWALD in Dallas, Texas. Baumler is attempting to locate this girl for us. This girl tried to tell the authorities but they ignored her completely.
