Dear Mr. Lawrence,

I'm ~~am~~ sorry my earlier and shorter letter on the Garrison interview was mislaid in your office. We have just moved and I cannot immediately find the carbon. So, I've written another.

It is longer but it is designed for cutting, should you so desire.

I can now explain an earlier phone call that may have mystified you. Eric Norden used an assumed name when he phoned Colonel Robert Castorr, who he discovered in WHITEWASH II. Castorr is an unusual case, a radical rightist who is not typical and who has strong policy disagreements with his colleagues. He was shabbily treated by the FBI and Secret Service, who, as I said, didn't even phone him. Had they, the course of the entire investigation might have been different, which perhaps explains the omission of the obvious.

Ultimately, Castorr accepted my invitation that we meet and talk. He has been cooperative and has led to much worthwhile information -and to additional and possibly vital suppressions. Because he was helping me he was apprehensive over Norden's call. I will tell you what we have learned through him when I am in Chicago. Possibly it might interest you. We may even have an assassination sex angle, priest unfrocking! We do have other threats to kill the President, in Dallas, and by Cubans! We may have the identity of the man who could have planted the bullet at the hospital. He has introduced investigators to sources of information that would otherwise have been inaccessible.
