

DA's Group Figures Garrison Owes Delegates \$8 for Banquet

The National District Attorneys Association figures that DA's John Garrison owes each delegate about \$8 for cancelling their convention last week because he wouldn't let them have a banquet.

The abrupt move by the volatile New York District Attorney Saturday was an unexpected annual conference cancelled in the middle of a week in conference.

Garrison, who has Kennedy assassination, he here stirred a national controversy and the cancellation of the banquet to leave his heated remarks regarding federal courts, the federal government and the President.

His actions were completely irrational, said William Raggio, Ratt, New association president in the first place, if only the banquet. The banquet was one of the things covered by the \$8 registration fee paid by each delegate.

Raggio said the association was notified Saturday that Garrison intended to make the banquet speech after learning that he planned a sharp attack on federal courts.

The association had been assured before the convention that there would be no attempt to use it as a public forum in the Garrison problem, Raggio added.
