Probe Can't Be Stopped, Garrison Says

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP)-Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison said "there's no way in the world" to stop his investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

"All they can do is slow it down," Garrison said yesterday after a series of developments.

These included:

A request for a subpoena directing the Central Intelligence Agency to produce what Garrison claims is a long-suppressed photo of Lee Harvey Oswald, named by the Warren Commission as the assassin of Kennedy.

Refusal by the Justice Department to permit an FBI agent to testify before the Orlean County grand jury on his role in the investigation of the 1963 assassination.

A report of a tape recording which purportedly indicated a bribe had been offered for a statement to help substantiate

statement to help substantiate
Garrison's probe.
The application for the subpoena called on Richard Helms,
CIA director, to produce before
the grand jury a "true photograph" of Oswald and a burly
Cuban which Garrison says was taken in front of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City.

Garrison contends the photo was suppressed and a "fake photograph" was submitted in evidence before the Warren

Commission.
