

## Mark Lane Sees Garrison, Predicts Big Things

NEW ORLEANS, March 28—Author Mark Lane said today that "the eyes and ears of the world will perk up" when District Attorney Jim Garrison's Kennedy assassination investigation is completed.

Lane, whose book, "Rush to

Judgement," criticized the Warren Commission's report on the assassination, conferred during the afternoon with Garrison and his investigators.

"I think this country will learn much when this case comes to light," Lane said when he and Garrison

emerged from the District Attorney's private office to pose for photographers.
