CITIZERSHIP AND PASSFORTS: Lee marvey Oswald

The American Embassy 1236.12

The Embassy's Dispatch Lo. 335 of February 26, 1961, concerning Lee Harvey Oswald has been strained to the paragraphs thereof. Dispatch Lo. 559 of March 26, 1961 concerning him has also beennoted.

If and when Mr. Oswald appears on the Lebassy, he should be thoroughly questioned regarding the concentrations of his mandance in the Soviet Union and his possible commitment of an act or seek if smallfation and, as contemplated by the Embassy, his statements should be taken under eath. If the Embassy is fully uatherfied that he has an act to appart from the Poviet Union to travel to the United States, his assport may be delivered to him on a personal basis only, after heir amonged value for direct return to the United States. For security mandal, the Department does not consider that it would be prodent for the Embassy to forward Oswald's passport to him by mail.

The Department is not in a position to advise in forward whether upon his desired return to the Inited States he may be amenable to prosecution for any possible offenses equilitted in inclusion of the Inited States or the laws of any office Swands.

The developments in the case of ir. Oscala should be promptly reported. In particular, a report of his travel data should be submitted when the Embassy receives confirmation of his prove. plans.

It may be added that Ers. Targuer to Total has non imported of the address given by Er. Cawaid in his mount outlied a decoution referred to in dispatch No. 535 and of the desires to return to the mount of thates. She has also been appropriately informed in the Fight with rate No. 659.
