In the elaborate checkout of Oswald's trip to Mexico, the FBI interviewed one William George Gaudet (CG 75: 588,652. SA John William Miller (N.O.) concludes the ~~second~~ of the two paragraphs of the 11/27/63 report of his interview of that date with this elliptical sentence:

GAUDET ~~also~~ indicated that he has in the past been an employee of the CIA.

I have long wondered why Gaudet would have volunteered this in an investigation of Oswald and why the FBI would not have omitted it.

In an excerpt from Ulrich International Periodical Directory just sent me there is perhaps the answer. This is from the latest issue, presumably, but I do not know.

Under Latin American Report is a listing for the magazine, established 1956, and Newsletter, est. 1946. The editor and publisher is given as W.G. Gaudet, the address International Trade Mart, New Orleans, Box 2567.

In some cities Latin American Report shares offices with the Citizens' Committee for a Free Cuba. Gradually I am accumulating some data on both, indicative of CIA involvement and of extremist Cuban interest or participation in.
