Francis Gary Powers, the former spy piane pilot, has gone to work for a Canadian company that makes aircraft equipment. When his U-2 was shot down over the Soviet Union in 1960, Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev canceled a summit meeting with President Dwight D. Eisenhower. After he was released from a Soviet prison in 1962, he worked as a test pilot for Lockheed Aircraft Corporation and last year was employed as pilot of a traffic-spotter, plane for a Los Angeles radio station. Mr. Powers is now a senior sales administrator for Garrett Manufacturing Ltd., in Rexdale, Ontario.
