## Jury Chosen for George's Retrial

A jury of eight women and four men was selected yesterday for the retrial of Clair E. George, a former top CIA official accused of lying to Congress and a grand jury about the Iran-contra affair.

Opening statements will be presented today after U.S. District Judge Royce C. Lamberth reads the seven-count indictment. George, who once directed CIA clandestine operations, has pleaded not guilty to charges that he testified falsely about his knowledge of key Irancontra players—those who sold arms to Iran and supplied arms to the Nicaraguan contra rebels. George's first trial last summer ended with a hung jury.

The new jury includes a postal clerk, a billing manager, a diesel mechanic, a telephone company technician and an air traffic control specialist. The others are a Justice Department specialist on expert witnesses, a microfilm clerk, a printing specialist, an unemployed sales representative, a bill collections specialist, a communications clerk and a public school reacher.
