Recouse \* mos you ere concerned with his and the family's interest, I tell you that my recollection is odorn ou this. The sur the father identified "Earlo" as Mario Bermuder. They said they had never seen him, but they also said that "the children" had identified him by name. Thather or not they included their rea with "the children" I esanot be sure of without replaying the tope, but there is no doubt they did include Dione Torner and Real Marke. Because they did complain to both the high school and the junior high school in the area, there may be an official record. More, bull volunteered to me that Mario had had Philip, and when Mione learned I had excited to the father and the mother, and same no, "hid they tell you about "ario"". There read no the chance that the children were in error. However, with the close relationship between Dermudez and Cher, I think I need not cappesize the potential significance of this. also, while Philip said Kerio had merely told him of having a purple car. This may not be accurate, but is there any reason to believe he had any kind of an involvement with Ferrie? On the besis of what we know, there is not. Ferrie got into difficulties when sex charges were presend against him well before thilip was connected with the tivil Air Patrol Codets. There was no apparent reason for any Jefferson Farish interest in Ferrie, his death not having occured in that jurisdiction, and there was no reason to connect Philip with Ferrie or his death. Can you imagine what would have he opened to the sheriff a diffice had they given every member of the cadets the time and attention they gave Philip? Their interest, then, was exceptional and not for the reasons given.

Remarker, he told us that they questioned him about lione, and the mother, ss I recoll, confirms his statement they stipulated their interest in her was because she was part of a "sex ring". The is quite capable of surfacing in some menner in the defense in the Show trials, or in the papers, which she would desrly love, perticularly now, when she is in other and serious difficulties. Her attorney represents a number of those involved. He is Wilton Brener. She also told me what I do not believe (yet I do have partial and unbiased confirmation), that Ferrie gave her flying lessons. She had much accurate information about him. I do not know the source.

So we have Phillip, taken out of Garrison's jurisdiction, by an office that had neither interest nor reason for it, and questioned, from his eccount, about irrelevant things? That does not make sense. I am not assting doubt on him or the mother. I am persuaded this did happen. I am suggesting those who did this questioning had interests other than they specified. Dione was not part of any sex ring and there is no reason to presume Phillip had any connection with Garrie. And this immediately upon Ferrie's death, and Garrieon says Ferrie and Shew were co-conspirators? Now Phillip gave us but a single name, that of the deputy who had conducted the investigation when he ren away. Nothing came up in this investigation, theseport wat of which I showed you, to warrant his interest in Phillip when Ferrie died. And the man accompanying him, from what Phillip seid, coult well have been one who was desaid's age, was in Ferrie's CAP Unit, was a member of the New Orleans vice aquad, and gave entirely inadequate testimony before the forcest commission. That he did this in Jefferson Perish, in company with the Jefferson deputy, alleging failedly this was for Garrison, does excite interest.

I think in everyone's interest, when I am there again, which will be before the Shew triel starts, we or I should speak to "hilip again. It might be better to do this without his mother being present, because he may be emberrassed by some of it and because he may be unwilling to let her know that he may have lied to her in the past. If you or she want her to be present, that is okey with me. If you do not want to be present or feel you cannot take the time, you have my assurance I will not in any way abuse him or take adventage of him. I think you know from what you observed I am also trying to serve his interest. Sere, however,

with the passing of time. I also believe that this should be done as soon as possible, before there is any possibility of his being publicly involved in enything. I just cannot believe he was subjected to such an unusual questioning, later repeated on tape, threatened, with his parents involved, for no reason at all. There is every reason to believe it had some connection with Garrison's investigation. Without doubt, Dione knows about it, for she made a number of elliptical references to it to me.

lease do not misunderstand the foregoing. When I said if you could not participate, I'd speak to 'hilip elone, I was not suggesting you absent yourself. I would much prefer that you or your husband participate. When I said I'd prefer that the mother not be with 'hilip, I did not meen her recollection should not be recorded. I think it should be. But in the interests of learning the truth, I think they should be speken to separately. She has a very natural desire to protect her son. She may not know the best way to do it. With the Werren Commission, her's was not the best way.

If we can do this, I think it is still possible to avoid any public Carrison interest in Philip. He wants only "hilip's knowledge, not his emberrassment. Further, in the event the other side makes any moves, we will be in the best possible position if we are not taken by surprise and know the truth in advance. Aside from what, as an experienced lawyer, you might be able to enticipate, I encourage you to consider what "ione is capable of, for whatever motive, and to regard the Geraci evaluation of Raul as accurate. The might have some kind of involvement and he is, I think, capable of using Philip if he seems the change or if it seems desireable to him.

I will keep you pected. Meanwhile, hrs. Geraci did promise to do two things that should be done. Ihilip promised to make notes of enything that occurred to him as a consequence of my questioning. I would appreciate it if you would remind him of this and its potential importance to him and ask him to include all thing that may not seem particularly relevant to him on the ground they may have meaning to ma. If you recall that for whatever motive, no matter how patrictic he thought it may have been, he was consected with real fescists and with two men who did have a kind of connection with the murder of the Prewident and a threat to do it, what may seem irrelevant to him may be quite significant. Both of these men had federal connections, one as an intelligence man, the other as at least an informant. /sk him also, please, to include anything he knows about "ione and Reul, "hetevor, if snything, Bringuier might have told him, and anything he may know or have heard of any of the principals in the current case or those commected with him. I have the Tario picture, which I had forgotten at home, and will show it to him. Asida from the mustache, his description does fit. They have a paper in their Merio's handwriting. We should also have that any anything else they have in any way connected with this. In writing at this length, it is not my intention to burden you. I do, however, went to inform you as completely as I can. Thanks for your help.
