Thanks for your letter of the 19th and the enclosed San Francisco Chronicle review of Posner's book. It is a good thing you wrote KEEP! on the top because I have gotten sick of reading the glowing reviews and praise in the reviews that I have read. The comments on Failure Analysis will be helpful as I put together the lecture I will give at St. Anslem's College (where Dennis teaches) on Nov. 11th.

My radio appearance went very will. I know the person who does this show quite well. We are both from Milwaukee; in fact he was quite pleased to find out that I heard him on radio when he first broke into the business in Milwaukee back in the mid 1960s.
