Thanks for the letter and xerox copies of Jerry's recent articles. Your letter was somewhat delayed because it was first delivered to a local bank for some strange reason.

I am about half way through Frame Up. I am still so struck by the similarities to the JFK investigation. Also, your account of the mini-trial casts a very dark shadow on the operation of our court system.

My regular teaching duties have been taking up the bulk of my time. It seems I have so little time to do any outside reading during the semester. However, I do have this coming January off and I plan to use part of it to learn more about the FBI and the civil rights movement. I sent off a letter to Jerry this afternoon to get some more details about obtaining those sanitation worker and "invaders" files. I plan to make a trip up to Frederick to transport them back to Spartanburg.

My wife recently got some good news from Vietnam. Her father has at long last obtained a visa to leave. We are working through Senator Hollings office to arrange for him to come to the US. Of course, all this would be far simpler if we would have normalized relations with Vietnam long ago. I don't expect much leadership on this from Bush. We are still messing things up in Cambodia. In any case, we are hoping he will be in the US in a few months. My wife last saw him in Jan., 1971 when she left for school in the US.
