Enclosed you will find the very prompt response from Carroll & Graf to my letter of last week. I thought I would send you the original, although it does not contain any information about who wrote that note. Even though it appears they are delaying it by another month, I hope it is accurate and not what Dave Keck seems to have found.

I also want to let you know that I received Chapters 5-10, along with the Foreword last week. And today I received two chapters: Chapter 10: "Is There Any Limit On What the CIA is Capable Of? Or Did?" and Chapter 13: "The Politics of Lying" and "The Press Box Mentality". I assume you will be juggling chapters. According to the table of contents you sent along with your 11/12 letter I am only lacking the Preface & Conclusion, ~~and Chapter 11~~.
