Dear Karen,

Had you not written me about the Shaw broadcast, I'd have missed it. While I would not have missed much, I'm glad I didn't for I'd have wondered it I had, and I found some of the rest of the show worthwhile. One of the books I laid aside to do this work was on noise. And I have an interest in Margis, as you know, and found that part also worthwhile. Many thanks.

You and Ross have been helpful. There is nothing I can think of at the moment save that if you see anything in the papers you clip and send. On the Ray case, for example, your papers might carry what does not appear elsewhere. This is even more likely with the fascist-like Cuban activities, in which I have a continuing interest.

I did a book dealing with the Ray case eight months ago, I'll now be adding an epilogue, for I am still certain he was a decoy, still satisfied he was framed all around, including by his alleged defenders. He may yet escape it, his biggest liability being his own defense. As long as he lives it is at least possible.

I possibly never mentioned it, but I am also very interested in something calling itself the National States Rights Party, really virulent racists who are more anti-Semitic than anti-Negro. I have much on them in this Ray book (COUP D'ETAT). If you see anything on it or its personnel, I'd very much like it.
