Dear Earl,

Just as I was leaving for the regular checkup in Washington I got the mail and with it a fat packet of records in response to one of my many FOIA requests. I read the records on the trip to and from the hospital and enclose copies of those that I think can be of interest to you.

Maybe the opinion of the British expert is interesting, as it was to me. Or the arranging that the testing be in the private sector, which is not within FOIA. Or the claim to impartiality when the partisan Alvarez is on the panel.

I am not trying to remember all. I'll be going over these with more care when I can.

I would prefer that if you use anything you not connect it with these records. As you realize, this is a departure, but there is this reason for it: I want to continue to receive such records. I could have been denied these easily and properly because they are dated after my request. FOIA covers only existing records. If it is an accident, I don't want to wave a red flag. If it is deliberate, I don't want to attract the attention that could end if. I could appeal some of the withholdings but I'm not going to for these reasons.

Uroge is anxious to get the affidavit.

Any thoughts about it?
