

Dear Mr. Weisberg,

Once again, thanks for taking the time to write. Enclosing the series on the Excelsior editor's Chinese trip. As far as I know not available in English but I'm sure you'll find someone to translate. It's nearly a second language in some areas of the U. S. Or, next time you're in Wash. an embassy employee could find the time, or, perhaps a student.

Back to my favorite subject, Kaplan. What I've finally decided to do is this: Do a magazine piece with an AP writer here who has had access to files not open to the public, giving all of the original testimony - and even that is conflicting! Nevertheless, it sheds more light on many legal or illegal manueverings. And between what he has dug up and what I have, we, together, might have more combined info on the case than anyone else. All We're waiting for is for him to complete his AP assignment which should be out on the wires soon and which will not reveal too much or anything at all of what I have as our agreement was for him not to see my files until his copy is released. I think his story should serve our ultimate purpose of getting a book publisher, so we can investigate further. My friend is honorable and has a detective's mind and is more objective than I. So with the combination of different facts and different approaches, we should stir up enough conjecture to last until the end of the century at least - or, until you find a means to keep the public conjecturing over what of course is a much more important story.

You are right in assuming what I tell you is in confidence. I hope the above might be the means by which we might meet and discuss our cases in person.

Your impression on Nizer quite accurate, not on my judgment but by a lady who happens to have been a very close friends of Mildred, his wife, at the same time she was a very close friend of Joel Kaplan's mother when all lived in Manhattan.

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In analyzing the personality of Joel Kaplan, whom I visited about a dozen times, I would say he fits your description of the self-destructive type - in fact he admitted being in rebelion against a militant father with whom he had no communication whatsoever. He is also bitter over the fact his father left his estate in charge of the supposed villain uncle, A. J., head of the Kaplan fund. Reckless, daring, pirate-like, intellectual and seemingly outwardly timid - are part of the enigmatic traits of Joel's personality. *

As for Ramparts, the only work I ever did for them was to help investigate the Kaplan case. I left Mexico three years ago before the Olympics and severed relations with them at the same time as they called and asked me to look for a negative story on how Mexico had no housing for those expecting to come. Although I do believe in necessary illumination I do not believe in negative muckraking. The purpose obviously is quite different. The last I heard from Bill Turner was the reply he wrote to my letter which asked what happened at the N. O. trial. I've told you about it. But thanks for telling me about his limi-tations. Actually, he didn't go into much detail in his letter, it was more like assuaging my curiosity. He also mentioned he was having a difficult time freelancing so I don't know if he still is with Ramparts or not. In fact almost all of the people I knew on Ramparts are no longer with it. It now comes out of Berkeley, Cal., and I think Peter Collier is editor. He worked on the Kaplan case and came to visit here several years ago. He's quite bright, not at all a rabble-rousing type and an English literature professor. It might be that Ramparts has taken another slant under his direction, I really don't know. I haven't seen a copy in several years. Have you?

By the way, why was Bobby Kennedy satisfied with the whitewash of the assassination? Do you think the family knew what really happened? Or was Garrison right in this point at least, that Bobby unwittingly contributed to the assassination of his brother? Something about a boomerang reaction based on a suggestion of his that John followed?

I appreciate all your advice more than you can imagine. But if you knew that even Velasquez has sent up smoke screens you'd understand better why I need someone like the AP fellow to keep the script steady. And thanks for offering the NY Times clipping with the family quotes, I certainly can use it.

* More clearly - Joel's outer personality suggests a slight, meek, undemanding scapegoat. His brilliance and his past performances in looked-for dangerous situations reveal the inner Moel - talk about a whitewash - his whole dimeanor seems to be one - or else he could be a schizo -

Yes, I've talked with Joel's Mexican wife several times. She's a whore kexix he had to "marry" (He's still married to a woman in N.Y.) - because "every human privilege was denied me". (In Mexico, a man may have a woman for a weekend if he's well-behaved. In the case of Joel he had to pay for everything. Having a "wife" simplified matters. She doesn't expect to see Joel again even though she has a child of his.)

I do have several pictures, of Joel with Velasquez, of the dead man and the body that doesn't match his when alive, of a woman who came to Mexico and identified herself as the dead man's wife by means of a picture of herself and three children holding a picture of "daddy", when in fact she had only married him a few months before his murder.

I guess I'm only confusing you with bits of information, but I'm trying to give you the answers to your very kind suggestions.

I haven't been able to check anything on the King matter, but will keep trying.

I envy you having so much time to write, even though you seem so buried in it. But actually, I'm a divorced mother of two adolescents and therefore axaixided have a divided dedication. Which might explain, when I think of it, more accurately, why I need a co-author: I'm either stuffing cabbage or stuffing paper into the typewriter! And sometimes one is interrupted by the other.

Again, I cannot thank you enough for taking so much time from your work - which, by the way, is still mainly on the assassination? And thanks too, for your invitations to see your files and to visit. One can always hope that both Will be possible.
