Dear Harold,

Thank you for your letter and the enclosures. It was a pleasure to hear from you again, and we might meet in Washington next week. I am flying off this coming Wednesday.

I recall Dr. Edward Myers, the cultural attache in the US Embassy here, quite well and it was my understanding at the time that he was a CIA man. I do not question that they approached Professor Goodhart, but I am not certain that he would have needed pressure from the Embassy to write such a review. I knew him quite well and admired his fund of legal knowledge, and I think it would be wrong for this newspaper to pursue this story now that he is in no position to defend or explain himself.
