"If the day has come when it is possible to sheet our President down because some men disagree with his foreign policy, and the day has come that the moment his heart steps beating other considerations take over which conceal the total truth from the citizens of the United States, then the day has come when we have ceased to be a democracy."

Thus speke Jim Garrison, New Orleans district attorney, on N.B.C. television the night of July 15th. However we may feel about Jim Garrison's investigation, there is no doubt about the above statement. And if we wish to keep this democracy alive and fertile, then we must reject the Warren Commission Report as incomplete and inconclusive.

The 1967 Citizens' Committee of Inquiry does not subscribe to any single assassination theory, nor does it support any single theorist. Rather, we believe that an open, non-political investigation is called for, and to this end we are activating a national petition campaign. The petitions will include the signatures of many prominent people, and will be presented to the Federal Government. We would like to have your signature on this petition.

We are the democracy, and if we wish to continue this way, we must all help. Please sign the enclosed petition, collect other signatures for us, mail them in, and ask for others. If you can, drop us a note with your phone number, and let us know we can call on you for volunteer office work. Your personal help is needed, now.
