The more people approve my unpublished work the more I come to resent those things that have helped make me and them unpublishable.

I agree that there should be more on Malcolm X. Tell me where and how to get it. I've tried every source if I can think of, on both coasts. Meen the black militante cay-"Sure, we know the SIA did it: so what?" and presume that because they so beli we most of their people and the whote majority will assume as they do, they merely abdicate....Even Aing did not encour my latters, never even gent me a pro-form thanks for all four books. The trouble is we really have nothing on that assessination. Several have said they sould develop some information. Borly this morning I again wrote such a person, who promised me serlier and again in July that he'd come up with comorthing, and hear't replied be my lest inquiry int two months.

I appreciate your offer of help. They are few and far between. Post Mortem requires an addition f will make as soon as possible. Coup distablis now in New York, with the only copy I have to spera of PM. If anything levelops either way I'll let you know. Meanwhile, just talking about them might do some good.

Flo also offered to help. She hasn't responded to any of my letters. She sent me to the Tunstler law firm for help. There exive as they are, they said I'd hear in two days. In hear't heprened yet. The recess the excess of the contents of OOOP D'ALAF. I know she stoys busy. But I have get to find the one who stays as busy as I do, and I am dejected that she hear't taken the time to enswer one of the three letters I wrote. Such offers of "help" are botter unmade, for they rouse false hopes and waste time.

A recent exchange of letters with Sylvia also depresses. Vince told me she had given Thermley \$100 for his legal defense. Now I have resson to believe that Thramley has no problems with his legal defense and will use how weney for purposes she might not went. To fact, I believe he already has, and here used it to hurt me. I didn't tell her this, but I did try and elect her to what her unbridled emotions were driving her to. I think that if the learns her money was use for such purposes, she will be embarrassed. Her response was to tell me she could spend her money as she desired. Indeed she con! I can only regret that is she can spare such sums for such soum, she might have ported with a little when I couldn't find the mency to pay for documents in the Archives. That would have hought us 500 pages of them, perhaps 2,000 in mircoffilm. I cennot say all that I know about Thornley, not only because there will be a trial in hew Orleans but because he and Lifton have been making noises about suing me (with Sylvie's money?). But, as she should be able to realize, after she has given him the money there is nothing she can do that will do me any good. I sought only to help her get in a position where she might reduce the ultimate embarrassment to rerself over what she did, thinking, I have no doubt, that she was pursuing principle. Sylvis is the last of us I'd have expected to follow principles this way, or es she did in her book, by knowlingly misrepresenting the dates of appearance of the various books. I say "knowlingly" because she knew without my telling her and also because, while she was still correcting proofs, I told her. This sort of thing is not at all encouraging..... Is she indexing and annotating Epstein's Garrison book? I'd be unhappy but not surprised.

I am only too aware of the vile things Mark is and has been doing. Some of those he thinks receptive are not and inform me. Garrison will be lucky enough to survive himself. He will never survive the combination of himself, Mark and Mort. This will nebe problems for all of us. What Mark has done and ir doing is hurribl in many ways. Muchaz as I mount his endless this very, even more do I object to the retten little things that interfere with work. If he is so goddmaned lary he will not do any (which may be a blessing, for he has a unique bland of incompetence and dishonesty which is frightening), the least one might expect of him is leaving others alone. He has, for example, campaigned up and down the mest coast in a number of ways, one of which has the effect of supporting themsely and agreeing with Lifton. This has turned off a number of sources.

Well, these are not the thoughts you saked for, but with interest on my enormous indobtedness due and not on hand, with three unpublished manuscripts and three helf-done ones, they are the kind that do not contribute to constructive work and do intrude on my conscious thought too much.

I have heled to help Eric Morden descrite resonant of the injustices his own ignorance of the subject prevents his knowing he did me, without so intending. He thinks he was kind. Playboy even said they'd pay me for some of the work. They haven't, and I flow to bicago, etc. I have an led him which-dozen times without getting any response. I hid quite a stack of evidence for him in a field in which he was writing. I have getten three reports of troubles with his book andk have tried tox cell him about this, to at least let him know. We response. I had a lot of Minutemen and Lational States Rights forty stuff for him-original and unpublished. Here is where he and Flayboy asked for nelp. If he is doing a book on Malcolm %, fine. I is certainly needed. But I censot weste this kind of time trying to belt these who will not be helpen.

Hogs you can do Gary some good. He's a great guy, I wrote him yesterday.

Frankly, I dispair of getting a publisher and if I have the kind I had with Canyon, progressive that is, I think I'd rather be unpublished until I dan gring my own work out. The magnitude of the potential disaster is not yet apparent, except to me. To save a possible - not certain - few housy buth any are knuckling in to Bringuier's blackmail, with all the evil inherent is it. They have never done a thing with the book. In fact, they made no trade announcement, even belatedly, when I maked it. The one thing they did you were present for, and half of that was my expanse. I cannot go deeper in debt to bring my own work out. Here is where help against Dell might have helped, for they do one me considerable money. I could pay off some of my indebtedness and publish a book for part of it.

If I cannot get help from the belok organizations on GOUP D'STAT, which I know is very important to them, I simply will do no more core in them area. There is too much to do in too many fields. I have, to this day, in more than two mouths, not gotten a single one of them even to read the book. In fact, I've not gotten a single response. I think they can, without it coating them a single went, make it possible for me to bring this book out. But if wonderful people like Flowill not even respond, what can I expect?

You ask if I will help at the time of the anniversary. Of course, but I'll require my costs returned - at the present rate, possibly even advanced. The one complication I can anticipate is a commitment to go to Galifornia. The San Diego group wents me to speak there and can arrange some of my transportation costs. As soon as the rest can be arranged and there is time for the necessary promotions, I will go, because there is much that must communicate to others working out there that dere not by phone or mail, and there are remnants of my provious work out there not followed up on. I never get out those without significent results. Last time I trained Hall, Howard and others on-and haver got

my promised expenses refunded. That one cost ma over \$500. And it is not the only one to Calif. for which I did not get the promised expenses refunded. Merk has been busy steeling and defaming, but when Liebeler had him on the ropes and running and Maggie and bill C'Connell begged me he cope out and take the heat off, I abandoned MHTEGASH II, then coming off the presses, and did just that. However, there is much fruitful, work to be done out there and he soon as it is possible I will have to go there. These are the only two things I can now enticipate that could prevent my being in New York.

I am working in more grees than you would insigne, and every lead is panning cut, which merely adds to my unease about my personal situation. There is a greater bazard to me in COIT than in any of my other work, as you will see. Since hal was here I have done what projected as an addition to it that is half book length. I so underded where to use it, or have I am setting it on separ. I could do a book on daweld as an agent with what I have end nothing else. I could do a book on other aspects alone, either of these in less than two weeks. Vince, Gary and Hal went me to do a book on apatein. I agreed, under certain conditions that I recified. They have not respended so I cannot do it! I called that certain things be done so that show viking brings his thing out I can get the opportunity to oppose it and him on the medic, as now one also of us can. Silence. I feel very much alone, Trent. The two things I do not really need are proise and sympathy. Meaningful help is rarely forthcoming, except from wonderful people like Mal and Gary. Steve Burton nees wonders when I am out there.

You do not begin to know or understand thou difficult this all is in the Garrison area and it is perhaps just as good that you do not. It is a major, dominature, control ing rabber. Cylvis has been responsible for more here than she can realize, for she has made order cyll beings possible. But the "sourceles" or the least of it. The ineptness and incompetence of the other side is all that saves it.

I remble. On the picture: I think I can use it wither as a cover on COUP, with hollow white latters for the printing, or as a back cover, or an inside cover. The picture was taken by a Touston photographer. Matt Herron has promised to put me in touch but hear't. In six mentic, the peater Carol sent me is the only copy I've been able to get... We have little wall space, as you know. We have the poster on the inside of the living room door, tell Carol. Decade do see it.

These moods never held me for long, as coon as I cleen up a little on the draft of COUP I len to complete FM. A friend is trying to introduce both in New York. Both are now in the bonds of one man who did express interest. My fours for both, ever and above my original hisbilities and the additional ones mark is so lustily adding, are simple; both are very fough books.

If you promise to keep the contents of both confidential, save (s you might have to discuss them with possible publishers, I will try and arrange to make copies available in "ew York. Low long will it take you to read them? COUP is short 200 double-spaced pages, "M about 185 single-spaced, legal pages. You have a difficult position, having to try and maintain one of maitrality, hence i put it this way. Some of what I let others see in confidence wound up in Thompson's book. In fact, this is 186% of what he had that was not published earlier. It is from PM.

Dear Harold:

I saw your letter to Carol, and I am answering it for her, as I was set to write to you about now.

Carol will be sending you the other poster; she's delighted you like it.

And I will try to find out about that other photo for you. And how would Carol's poster do for a back book cover?:

No. I haven't heard from Bernebei. Immediately after I returned from Toronto. he hombarded Gary Murr and Dick Sprague with questions about what I had learned there, and they both told him to write to me if he wanted any information. And of course he hasn't...perhaps by now he is aware many people regard him with great suspicion.

I am currently trying to represent Gary Murr with the publishers here, and see if I can do anything with his book on Similas. Perhaps I might be able to aid you at the same time, if you want me to try. No guarantees, of course, but someone has to keep up the pressure. Hal tells me your <u>Post-Mortem</u> book is really marvellous; I would like to see it, and see what might really be done with it here, both to get a publisher, and see that it is <u>really</u> marketed. Your <u>Coup</u> <u>D'etat</u> sounds like it might really sell, in addition to being good; but I would express the same reservation that Hal did...Malcolm X should get some good coverage in it. Did you know that Eric Norden, who did the Realist article, is doing a whole book on the subject? In any case, let me have your thoughts, suggestions, etc.

Now for the main subject of the letter. With whatever resources are at our command at the time, we intend to make a big thing out of the coming fifth anniversary of the assassination, centering on November, 21, 22, and 23. I plan for a big public program on the night of the 22nd, with a continual round of radio and television interview shows organized for the researchers on all three days. And, of course, public petitioning, pasting, leafleting, etc. In short, with the anniversary upon us, and the trials of Ray (?) and Sirhan set to begin in Nov., we will make the most out of it. We will try to get backing for a new investigation from prominent people, we will arrange demonstrations wherever neccessary, and if podsible, new evidence will be released through press conferences. And, for the benefit of the researchers, we are trying to get everyone here, and have a sort of private convention, with an exchange of information.

I don't have to tell you how difficult this all is in the Carrison era, what with all the squabbles etc., but I will do the best job possible using, as I say, whatever resources are available. So, please consider being here then, (when we will make the greatest use ever of the media, I hope!), and try to keep those dates free. Meanwhile, keep well, and you will be hearing from me again very soon.
