OSWALD IN NEW ORLEANS

General Press Release - Feb. 20th.

Was Lee Harvey Oswald an agent for the C.I.A.? Who were his friends in New Orleans? Was he a pro-Castro leftist, or a right-wing extremist in disguise? These questions, among many, will be discussed in the fourth of a series of panel discussions on the assassination of President Kennedy. The place is the Orpheum Theatre, 126 Second Avenue, on Monday, March 4th, at 8.00pm. The chief panelist will be Harold Weisberg, author of Oswald in New Orleans, and the Whitewash series.

Harold Weisberg, a former Senate investigator, has privately published his Whitewash series with the intent of reaching the largest number of people, and bringing to them some of the facts of the assassination. Two of this series have since been published by Dell; and now Canyon books brings us "Oswald in New Orleans", subtitled "Case for Conspiracy with the C.I.A.". Mr Weisberg has done considerable original research in New Orleans, and has made many discoveries regarding Lee Harvey Oswald's activities there. He has a wealth of information to offer.

On the same evening, some new evidence on the assassination will be presented, evidence not related directly to Mr. Oswald, but to Dallas, and the events of November 22nd, 1963.

There will be other critics present, both in the audience, and as panelists. The evening will be moderated by Trent Gough, the National Chairman of the Kennedy Assassination Inquiry Committee.
