If there is anything further you require of me, I wil be glad to supply it promptly if I am told what it is. But I have made r peated requests, I have been repeatedly turned down, and this is consistent with network policy on the subject.

Perhaps it is further proof? To this end I enclose what I ask you to return to me, the receipt No. 939212, dated august 10. 1971 and stamped with the name of the law firm and signed illegibly. This should give you the proof that I did send the letter and that it was received. Having h a no response, I, of course, can't send you that.
