

Dear Mr. Hall,

In your letter of the 18th you say you are investigating the connection between George DeMohrenschildt and Voytek Frykowski, a victim of the Manson murders as part of an alleged connection between the JFK assassination and the Manson murders. You ask if I know of any connection between Frykowski and DeMohrenschildt.

I don't. I also don't know of any connection between the two crimes. Going farther, I have no reason to believe there was or could have been.

There has been much theorizing about DeMohrenschildt and much fabrication. In addition, after he was quite sick he is said to have said certain things that are given special meanings. Neither what is attributed to him nor those who make the attribution have minimal credibility.

There also has been much theorizing about the assassination, in virtually all cases without factual foundation. One can theorize endlessly if one is not inhibited by fact.

In your theory you first have to establish a connection between DeMohrenschildt and the crime. I know of no reason to believe you can do this. That he knew Oswald is meaningless. At the time of the crime he was and had been in Haiti for the better part of a year, as I recall about nine months. To overcome this fact people like Jim Garrison just imagined that he had been Oswald's "baby-sitter" for an intelligence agency.

If you want to theorize, you have to do it in terms of what is known of the crime. While there never was any real investigation of it, some basic facts are beyond reasonable question. Theorizing, therefore, if it is to be responsible, must be in terms of what is known about the crime, not what is imagined about it.

I don't know that my books can help you because there is nothing in them that I recall that lends any support at all to your theory. However, in the event you want to learn more about the crime I include a list of them. I don't recall if any of them is in your library.


Sirs

I am investigating the connection of the Manson case with the Kennedy assassinations and would appreciate any assistance.

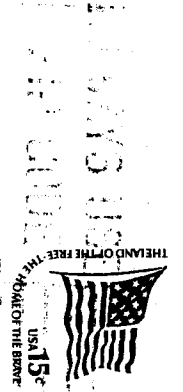
