The scar you refer to is not indicated on the autopsy and, unlike that of JFK, his was a thorough one, with scars less than a quarter of an inch and tiny scratches carefully recorded.

If I get to New York I'll give you a call so you can show me what you described, if you'd like. However, I am pressed for time by the many things in which I'm engaged and can't engage in much correspondence about this.
