Shaw Trial Judge Fired Off Bench

NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 23-The judge who presided at the conspiracy trial of Clay Shaw, accused in a plot to murder President John F. Kennedy, foday was removed from the bench for heavy drinking, gambling and consorting with underworld figures.

Louisiana Supreme The Court voted 6-to-1 to remove Judge Edward Haggerty Jr. from his Criminal District Court position.

The ruling said Haggerty engaged in "willfull and intentional" brought disgrace on the judiciary.
