

17 Defense Witnesses Named In Haggerty 'Stag Party' Case

A total of 17 defense witnesses have been subpoenaed in the Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. case, in which the judge is charged with obscenity, soliciting for prostitution and resisting arrest.

Trial is set for 10 a.m. Monday in the criminal district courtroom of Judge Matthew S. Braniff.

The charges against Judge Haggerty resulted from a police vice squad raid Dec. 17 in which Judge Haggerty and 13 others were apprehended in a room at the De Ville Motel, 3800 Tulane Ave.

It was alleged obscene films and a live "stag show" were the purpose of the gathering. Participants contend the affair was a "bachelor party" for one of the men who was to be married soon.
