Haiti protested to the United Nations because the United States has taken no action against Haitian exiles who took part in a bombing attack June 4 on the palace of President Francois Duvalier.

Ambassador Marcel Antoine said in a letter to U.N. Secretary General U Thant that seven Americans, a Canadian and two Haitian ex-

iles living in New York took part in the raid. Antoine said, "It is the duty of the state of asylum to prevent persons granted asylum in its territory from plotting to invade their country of origin . . ."
