

MIAMI — Twelve men were arrested yesterday when police raided a remote camp in the Everglades that they said was a secret military base for Haitian exiles who want to overthrow President Francois Duvalier.

Among those arrested were two Americans, who unofficial sources said were former members of the Green Berets, the Army's elite Special Forces unit.

Police said they confiscated 16 rifles, 16 revolvers and a cache of ammunition.

The two Americans and the 10 Haitians were held as material witnesses in a fatal shooting at the camp.

The police became aware of the camp when they stopped a car carrying a man who had been shot in the chest. Monroe County Sheriff Robert Brown said the man "apparently was

shot during a training maneuver."

The camp was located 50 miles west of here and two miles from the nearest road, just north of the Everglades National Park.
