

Shot and Kicked, Panther Testifies

CHICAGO — A Black Panther Party member testified yesterday that he was shot five times, kicked to the floor and handcuffed by police who raided a Panther apartment.

Ronald Satchel, who survived the Dec. 4, 1969, raid in which two Panther Party leaders were killed, testified for the prosecution in the conspiracy trial of Cook County State's Attorney Edward V. Hanrahan and 13 co-defendants.

Satchel told essentially the same story of the raid as did two Black Panthers who preceded him on the stand. But he was the first to identify a member of the raiding party in the courtroom.

Satchel strode from the witness stand to the defense table and pointed to Edward Carmody. He said Carmody was the policeman who stood in the door of a bedroom after ordering Satchel out of the room.
