Hanrahan Deputy Testifies for State

CHICAGO—First Assistant State's Attorney Jack Schmetterer testified for the prosecution yesterday at the trial of his boss, States' Attorney Edward V. Hanrahan, in the Chicago Black Panther case.

Special prosecutor Barnabas Sears questioned Schmetterer only briefly. Sears' queries were limited to whether Schmetterer had brought into court documents relating to the Dec. 4, 1969, police raid on a Black Panther apartment in which two Panthers were killed.

Schmetterer told Sears, in sometimes chilly exchanges, that he had brought all the documents which he could find, but rattled off a list which he said were those not available.
