Bob McKnight was leading the discussion. And he said some what in these words; I cannot quote it exact - that Martin Luther King thinks he's gonna march, but there's a man that was at my house from northern Mississippi, A young man, who thinks different, and he sort of intimated that Martin Luther King would never live to carry out that march. shocked I - this struck me so much that the conversation begin to tone down when someone evidently gave him the sign that I was in the - and the other lady was in their presence, because at first we have been prevoously sitting at another table. But in the course of the closed Session, Mr. Graham and Mr. Latham continued to be interested in carrying the conversation, talking about the curfew and the lack of and various Things, sale of liquor, to divert my attention from the general -**o**£conversation at the end of the table. But the only thing that I definitely remember, and it did not occur to me that - the significance of this until after Dr. King was killed. And that in the frame conversation it was mentioned that there was a - was a white brain building billy directly across from the hotel in which this person would be stationed. Now, I did not know the significance of this because I - because it puzzled me for a while. I could not place in my mind a white ragged building or white frame house of any kind of

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that description directly across from a hotel. Never having gone to the Lorraine Hotel in my life not in - not in - down in that area, not eited(?) sighted remember picture in my/life that I could never picked a this type of situation and I thusignificance of this did not realize that the rest of them did until afterwards. But from general conversation that I have, that if the Justice Departemtn the Subpina would appeal to Mr. Bob McKnight, Mr. Bob Farley, and Mr. Winfield that they can get the complete description and the names of the assassins of Dr. Mertin Luther King. Lasert -Matt. Harold? Yes, I think I got it all well.

- Matt. Well, I don't really care about the money.
- Hw. There's an advantage to caring about the money. It will enable you to do other things. And it's a funny thing, Matt. People seem to suspect what they get for nothing.
- Matt. Huh.
- Hw. I I look. You should have had more experience along that line than I.
- Matt. Yes. Well, what I have done, I shipped a tape off earlier this evening to my agent in NY.
