Dear Dr. Weisberg:

As I am sure you are aware, Harrison Livingstone and Robert Groden's new book, High Treason, has recently been published by the Conservatory Press. I am happy to report at this time that a groundswell of interest in High Treason has emerged here in Washington, as well as in Baltimore, Philadelphia, New York and Dallas.

After conducting a live eight-minute interview with Harrison, WBAL-TV in Baltimore has expressed continued enthusiasm towards pursuing the case, and has remained in close contact with Harrison and myself. WCAV-TV in Philadelphia has expressed similar interest. The Montgomery County Papers, which has a circulation of 100,000, is preparing to run an article on the case written by Robert. Finally, the Baltimore Writers' Alliance has extended an invitation to Harrison and Robert to present their case on Wednesday, April 12th, before their distinguished audience and regular press.

To capitalize on the momentum generated by the event at the Baltimore Writers' Alliance, we have decided to hold a press conference Thursday, April 13th, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at the National Press Club.

On behalf of the authors and the Conservatory Press, I would like to extend an invitation to you to make a short statement at the press conference. We are also asking Senator Christopher Dodd, Congressman Henry Gonzalez, Colonel Fletcher Prouty, Victor Marchetti, Dr. Cyril Wecht, and Dr. Charles Wilbur to say a few words about the case. We would be honored if you would accept this invitation.

You may expect a phone call from either Harrison or Robert by the time you receive this invitation, or shortly thereafter, so that they may extend their personal invitation.


