Al Ahram Says Hijacking 🧎 Harms Guerrilla Cause

CAIRO, Sept. 8 (UPI)—The semiofficial Cairo newspaper, Al Ahram, said today that the hijacking of four airliners by Arab guerrillas tended to turn world opinion against the Palestinian cause.

"One of the main goals of the battle is to gain world public opinion on the side of the Palestinian struggle and not to

Palestiman struggle and not to lose it," Al Ahram said.
"It is evident that the attack on international civil aviation does not encourage world feeling of solidarity with the Palestine cause," it said. "On the contrary, it incites a feeling of criticism in the ordinary man."

"The 747 is the finest specimen in the air. But oddly enough it's becoming just about the easiest to catch And you won't have to go sneak-ing up on it if you're in Eu-rope on the way to the U.S.A."
