I am presently a graduate student at Drake University, involved in a quantitative research project concerning the House Select Committee on Assassinations findings on the assassination of John F. Kennedy. The project is an outgrowth of a consuming interest in the last three years in the assassination controversy. Recognizing your importance in the field, I am interested in your opinions and reactions to many concerns which I have regarding the Committee report.

The enclosed questionnaire is the data gathering instrument which I have developed. Would you please take a few minutes and respond to those questions you deem relevant? Please feel free to support as many of your views as you wish; none of your responses will be quoted. The responses will be used to write a paper summarizing the current reactions of experts to the findings of the House Select Committee. In four to six weeks, I would be delighted to send to you the raw statistics of the questionnaire if you wish a follow-up on your efforts in helping with the project.

Being a secondary social science teacher in the Des Moines schools, I intend to use the research to enhance the critical thinking of students.
