assassination attempt.

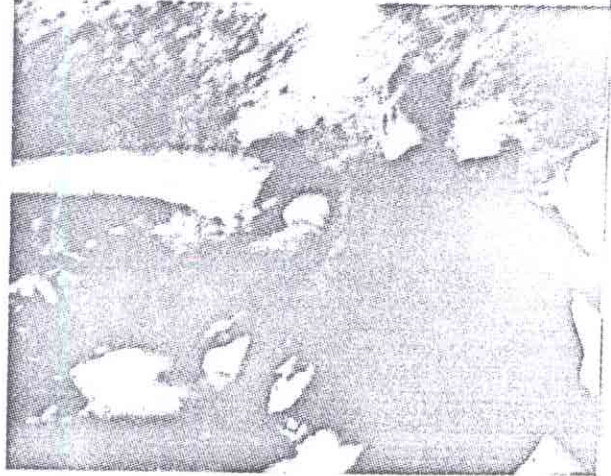
2:21 pm TOM WHALEN conducts an interview with

JEAN HILL: I heard two shots ring out. The
President fell over, and then Mrs. Kennedy
fell over him and shouted, "My God, he's
been shot." The car speeded away, and I saw
a man running back up the hill.

2:23 pm McGEE speaks by telephone with Robert
NEW YORK MacNeil, in Dallas.

MacNEIL: Last rites of the Roman Catholic
Church have been administered to President
Kennedy. This does not necessarily mean that
his condition is fatal. Vice President Lyndon
B. Johnson walked into the hospital where
the President is being treated. Mrs.
Johnson said her husband is all right. She
did not want to say anything about the
President; she is in a state of shock. A blood
transfusion is being prepared for President
Kennedy.... Gov. Connally was shot just

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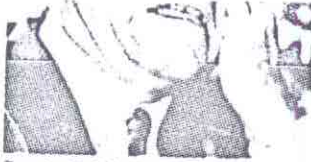
