American Lafectors to Sino-Sevict Elec Countries

Your memorandum of October 18 on the above subject raises certain questions which I believe you would wich to consider further:

Real designed to the first of the

1.) /re not the FBI and the CIA the primary sources of all data concerning insticants the have been recruited as intelligence agents by Elec countries? If so, would it be useful or necessary for the Department to have on hand current lists of such agents?

2.) In applying the term "defector" to Americans, would it not be proper to limit this description to these Americans who have either been expable of providing useful intelligence to the Elec or these whose desire to resolve in size countries has been significantly exploited for communist propagands purposes? This would meen that no attention need to paid to Americans whose resettlement within the Elec had no counterintelligence implications or had attracted no particular attention; for instance, this definition would not cover individual US citizens of Cast European or Chinese erican the returned to the "here Ind" because of mere instilling to edjust to American conditions.

3.) If the above definition of "defector" is seceptable, would it not be useful for SUA (and particularly ST) to compile a list of such persons covering the last 12 years or more? I an thinking that the defection of two US code clocks in Noncew in 1948 should be included in such a list.

As you requested, IfC has applied to GIA for assistance in varifying and possibly expanding the short list of American"defectors" within the past 18 menths. The Agency will also check on the few additional names attached to this memorandum.
