

TESTIFYING before the Senate permanent investigations subcommittee, philosopher Eric Hoffer, a former longshore-man turned author, said Friday that strong-willed administrators and not more laws are needed to counter the wave of disorders sweeping college campuses. Hoffer said, "You need chancellors of universities and mayors of cities who will get up in the morning and spit on their hands and say, 'Who am I going to kill today?'" Hoffer, a resident of San Francisco, has had the opportunity to view campus turmoil firsthand, since Bay Area colleges such as the University of California at Berkeley, San Francisco State and Stanford have all had their share of trouble.
