



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in the past, advised in February, 1943, DOROTHY WILSON was a member of the North Beach Branch of the Communist Party in California and attended her first Party meeting during that month.

This same informant later advised in 19th that DEMOTEY WILSON'S name was observed on the membership rells of the North Beach Branch of the Communist Party in March, 19th, and again in August, 19th.

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The files of the Cifice of Civilian Defence, City Hall, San Francisco, California, which were checked in 1944, reflect Mics Demothy Habit Wilson was empoled and fingerprinted by that organization on March 23, 1942, while residing at 10 Reno Place, San Francisco, California. 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On September 17, 1936, No. J. L. DRODERICK, Executive Director, said he does not know and cannot recall the employee. As of 1946 she indicated another residence as 1986 Summit Street, Columbus, Onio. The person to be notified in case of an emergency in New York City was listed as GENRITT E. FIELSTRA, 1293 Second Avenue, New York City. Her former employers were listed as follows:

Miss WEST advised the person who was the employee's supervisor during her employment here is no longer with captioned organization. She stated she can refer to no one else at Time, Incorporated, who would be in a position to furnish any information with regard to the employee.

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Iselys Cafeteria, Columbus, Ohio, June 7, 1905, to August 25, 1945.

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The records of the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D.C., which were utilized in 1955, reflected that on March 10, 1943, Mr. GERRIT E. FIRLSTRA, in charge of the Photostat Department, New York Public Library, was interviewed. He advised he and others formed the Discussion Group in 1933 to combat the "stodgy" conservative element in the library. He said he attended a couple Communist Party meetings in the Bronx, New York, and on 14th Street, New York City.

with the New York Public Library during the 1930's and 1940's, advised on July 11, 1955, he has been friendly FIELSTRA since about 1939 and that he has been friendly with that person since that time. He recalled that FIELSTRA was active in attempts to stir people up and to have changes made in the attitude of the library administration, but never considered him as being Communistic or subversive in any way at all. He explained that during the middle and late 1930's there was a great deal of a gitation on the part of the library workers to unionize and to secure better working conditions.

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Association which had for its purpose the employees'
welfare, to which organization all library personnel belonged.
He said that FILLSTEA, among others, was dispatisfied
with the Staff Association and unsuccessfully attempted
to form another organization for the purpose of bettering
working conditions.

stated FIELSTEA and
others got a union started, but it did not last very long.
He recalled FIELSTEA was very active in this effort and
was outspoken in his criticism of the library administration.
This informant felt that FIELSTEA's attitude at that time
was responsible for his not being advanced in the library.
He felt the union became pro-Communist because of the
meanner in which it attempted to attain its end and
because of the distribution of "Class Knut;" which, because
of its content, he regarded as very pro-Communist. He
stated he could not recall specifically the notheds the
union used or the content of that paper because of the
lapse of time since all this activity took place. He
advised he did not know if FIELSTEA was connected with the
union when it became Communist dominated and does not recall
if FIELSTEA had anything to do with the publication "Class
Mark."

FIELSTRA, in charge of the Photostat Department, New York Public Library, was interviewed. He advised he and others formed the Discussion Group in 1933 to combat the "stodgy" conservative element in the library. He said he attended a couple Communist Party meetings in the Bronx, New York, and on 14th Street, New York City.

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declared he never suspected FIELSTRA of being a Communist, subversive in any way, or disloyal to the United States. He said that to his knowledge GERRITT FIELSTRA associated with persons whom T-9 suspected as being Communists only in connection with the activities mentioned above, and he felt that FIELSTRA did this innocently as did many others not realizing that those persons were pro-Communist.

An examination of several of the 1935 copies of the "Class Merk" at the New York Public Library, 42nd Street and 5th Avenue, New York City, in 1953, disclosed that the masthead of this publication showed that it was published by the Communist Party, UJA, 50 East 13th Street, New York City.

On July 11, 1955, , who held a responsible position in the New York Public Library, and early 1940's, advised she recalled GERMITT FIELSTRA very well and stated she disliked him intensely. She said he belonged to, and was a leader in, a group that tried to form a union. This group opposed everything that the library administration tried to do for the employees.

Stated that FIELSTRA was very eutopoken and critical of the administration, and she added the group to which he belonged distributed a paper that attacked and vilified library officials. She said she did not know the name of the group or the paper.

advised she suspected FIELSTRA of being pro-Communist, but had no definite or specific information on which she bases her suspicion. The said that on one occasion when the overheard FIELOTRA conversing with another person she interrupted him and told him he was a Communist. She stated he vehemently denied this.

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was very active in the Discussion Group. She indicated that members of the Discussion Group were pro-C emmunist.

On June 23, 1955, Miss EVELINI SDARRA, Clerk, Credit Bureau of Greater New York, advised the Gredit Bureau files contain a report dated February 4, 1954, on GERRITT E. FIELSTMA. This report reflects FIELSTRA resided at 49 Prespect Street, Jersey City, New Jersey, formerly resided at 1233 Second Avenue, New York City, was married, and had grown children. The report noted that FIELSTRA had been employed with the New York Fublic Mbrary since 1928. His trade is satisfactory and there were no suits or judgments against him. Another report dated February 7, 1952, reflected FIELSTRA, who then resided at \$129 East 77th Street in New York City, previously resided at 219 East 77th Street in New York City.

The records of the New York City Police Department which were checked on June 27 and 28, 1955, by a representative of that organisation

The current New York Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhatton, New York, centains listings for HELEN NOWE and FRANKLEN WATES at the address 200 East 66th Street, New York City, both individuals having the same telephone number listing. The telephone directory also lists Franklin Watts, Incorporated, at 699 Madison Avenue, New York, New York.

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#### Miscellaneous

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The files of the Credit Dureau of Greater New York, which were checked by HELEH PUST on Septimber 4, 1956, contain no record of the employee.

A representative of the Europa of Special Services, New York City Police Department, advised on September 4 and September 10, 1990, no record of the employee, her husband, or her parents was located in the files of that agency.
