The Communist Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

[redacted], who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised during 1944 that DOROTHY WILSON, 300 Green Street, San Francisco, California, who formerly resided at 1255 Kearny Street, San Francisco, California, was a subscriber to the "People's World." This same informant later advised in 1944 that DOROTHY WILSON's name was observed on the membership rolls of the North Beach Branch of the Communist Party in March, 1944, and again in August, 1944.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated May 14, 1951, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C. contains the following concerning the "Daily People's World:"

She gave as her occupation clerical work and advised she was born April 15, 1920 in New York City.

A check of the records of the Retailers Credit Association, San Francisco, California, in 1945, disclosed, according to a report of June 29, 1942, DOROTHY H. WILSON resided at 1255 Kearny Street, San Francisco, California, and formerly had resided at 10 Reno Place in San Francisco. It was noted she was a clerical worker.

A representative of the Western Pipe and Steel Corporation, San Pedro, California, advised in 1945 DOROTHY HAZEL WILSON had applied for a position as a ship fitter in August, 1944, and had been hired that month. On November 2, 1955, _____ identified _____ as a visitor of DOROTHY WILSON on October 21, 1955. The informant added that _____ had on a few occasions visited WILSON prior to October 21, 1955.

_____, who is in a position to furnish reliable information, advised during April, 1956, that DOROTHY WILSON is currently employed by Helen Hoke Associates, Hotel Shelton, 49th Street and Lexington Avenue, New York City.

_____, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in October, 1955, that ISIDORE GIBBY FELDMAN, an attorney at 165 Broadway, New York City, formerly had been the attorney for the Amberg Trading Corporation, the registered Russian trade agency in the United States.

_____, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on October 26, 1955, advised DOROTHY WILSON has resided on the 10th floor of the apartment house located at 140 West 54th Street, Manhattan, New York. On November 2, 1955, _____ identified _____ as a visitor of DOROTHY WILSON on October 21, 1955. The informant added that _____ had on a few occasions visited WILSON prior to October 21, 1955.

_____, who is in a position to furnish reliable information, advised during April, 1956, that DOROTHY WILSON is currently employed by Helen Hoke Associates, Hotel Shelton, 49th Street and Lexington Avenue, New York City.

Information concerning Franklin Watts, Incorporated,

Miss WEST explained the employee was employed by Time, Incorporated, during her work period and returned to Antioch College thereafter. She stated the employee's record reflects her work was average, and that she needed quite a bit of supervision. Miss WEST advised that according to her record, the employee worked well with others when properly approached; she added the record indicates the employee was shy.

Miss ELLEN WEST continued by advising that an application of the employee dated October 23, 1946, reflects she resided at 1293 Second Avenue, in New York City, was born on October 2, 1929, and had Social Security Number 284-24-5372. As of 1946 she indicated another residence as 1986 Summit Street, Columbus, Ohio. The person to be notified in case of an emergency in New York City was listed as GEMMETT E. FIELSNER, 1293 Second Avenue, New York City. Her former employers were listed as follows:

Miss WEST advised the person who was the employee's supervisor during her employment here is no longer with captioned organization. She stated she can refer to no one else at Time, Incorporated, who would be in a position to furnish any information with regard to the employee.

The records of the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D.C., which were utilized in 1955, reflected that on March 10, 1943, Mr. GERRIT E. FIELSTRA, in charge of the Photostat Department, New York Public Library, was interviewed. He advised he and others formed the Discussion Group in 1933 to combat the "stodgy" conservative element in the library. He said he attended a couple Communist Party meetings in the Bronx, New York, and on 14th Street, New York City.

_____ who held a responsible position with the New York Public Library during the 1930's and 1940's, advised on July 11, 1955, he has known GERRIT FIELSTRA since about 1929 and that he has been friendly with that person since that time. He recalled that FIELSTRA was active in attempts to stir people up and to have changes made in the attitude of the library administration, but never considered him as being Communistic or subversive in any way at all. He explained that during the middle and late 1930's there was a great deal of agitation on the part of the library workers to unionize and to secure better working conditions.

_____ further advised there was in existence at the time, an organization known as the Staff Association which had for its purpose the employees' welfare, to which organization all library personnel belonged. He said that FIELSTRA, among others, was dissatisfied with the Staff Association and unsuccessfully attempted to form another organization for the purpose of bettering working conditions. _____ stated FIELSTRA and others got a union started, but it did not last very long. He recalled FIELSTRA was very active in this effort and was outspoken in his criticism of the library administration. This informant felt that FIELSTRA's attitude at that time was responsible for his not being advanced in the library. He felt the union became pro-Communist because of the manner in which it attempted to attain its end and because of the distribution of "Class Mark" which, because of its content, he regarded as very pro-Communist. He stated he could not recall specifically the methods the union used or the content of that paper because of the lapse of time since all this activity took place. He advised he did not know if FIELSTRA was connected with the union when it became Communist dominated and does not recall if FIELSTRA had anything to do with the publication "Class Mark."

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_____ advised that FIELSTRA was active in the mid 1930's in a group called the Discussion Group which lasted about one year and then passed out of existence. _____ believed the group was innocently organized and the purpose was to discuss current events. He recalled it quickly became infiltrated with Communists and Communist sympathizers and faded when the members realized what had happened.

_____ declared he never suspected FIELSTRA of being a Communist, subversive in any way, or disloyal to the United States. He said that to his knowledge GERRITT FIELSTRA associated with persons whom he suspected as being Communists only in connection with the activities mentioned above, and he felt that FIELSTRA did this innocently as did many others not realizing that those persons were pro-Communist.

An examination of several of the 1935 copies of the "Class Mark" at the New York Public Library, 42nd Street and 5th Avenue, New York City, in 1953, disclosed that the masthead of this publication showed that it was published by the Communist Party, USA, 50 East 13th Street, New York City.

On July 11, 1955, _____, who held a responsible position in the New York Public Library, _____, New York City, during the 1930's and early 1940's, advised she recalled GERRITT FIELSTRA very well and stated she disliked him intensely. She said he belonged to, and was a leader in, a group that tried to form a union. This group opposed everything that the library administration tried to do for the employees.

_____ stated that FIELSTRA was very outspoken and critical of the administration, and she added the group to which he belonged distributed a paper that attacked and vilified library officials. She said she did not know the name of the group or the paper.

_____ advised she suspected FIELSTRA of being pro-Communist, but had no definite or specific information on which she bases her suspicion. She said that on one occasion when she overheard FIELSTRA conversing with another person she interrupted him and told him he was a Communist. She stated he vehemently denied this.

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An examination of several of the 1935 copies of the "Class Mark" at the New York Public Library, 42nd Street and 5th Avenue, New York City, in 1953, disclosed that the masthead of this publication showed that it was published by the Communist Party, USA, 50 East 13th Street, New York City.

On July 11, 1955, _____, who held a responsible position in the New York Public Library, _____, New York City, during the 1930's and early 1940's, advised she recalled GERRITT FIELSTRA very well and stated she disliked him intensely. She said he belonged to, and was a leader in, a group that tried to form a union. This group opposed everything that the library administration tried to do for the employees.

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_____ further advised that FIELSTRA was very active in the Discussion Group. She indicated that members of the Discussion Group were pro-C communist.

On June 23, 1955, Miss EVELYN SBARRA, Clerk, Credit Bureau of Greater New York, advised the Credit Bureau files contain a report dated February 4, 1954, on GERRIT E. FIELSTRA. This report reflects FIELSTRA resided at 49 Prospect Street, Jersey City, New Jersey, formerly resided at 1293 Second Avenue, New York City, was married, and had grown children. The report noted that FIELSTRA had been employed with the New York Public Library since 1928. His trade is satisfactory and there were no suits or judgments against him. Another report dated February 7, 1952, reflected FIELSTRA, who then resided at 1293 Second Avenue, New York City, previously resided at 219 East 77th Street in New York City.

On September 11, 1956, Mr. FRANKLIN WATTS, Franklin Watts, Incorporated, Publishers, 699 Madison Avenue, New York, New York, advised the employee is married to his wife's son, JOHN L. HONE. He added that his wife's name is HELEN HONE WATTS. He claimed to have known the employee since about 1948 while she was attending Antioch College. Mr. WATTS stated he would recommend

the employee as to character, reputation, and associates on an unqualified basis. He said he has no reason to question her loyalty or the loyalty of any member of her family.

FRANKLIN WATTS continued by advising that in 1948 or 1949 the employee stayed for 5 or 6 weeks with his wife at 101 West 55th Street, New York City, while she was employed during a work period out of Antioch College, which conducted a study-work program. Mr. WATTS explained that students at Antioch College would work approximately 6 weeks and then return to school for about the same period alternating in such a way in connection with their study-work program. WATTS advised that at other times when the employee was in the New York City area she probably resided at various rooming houses, but WATTS did not know exactly where or at what addresses the employee lived.

On June 15, 1956, a review of the records of the County Court Clerk's Office, Borough of Manhattan, New York, disclosed that a Certificate of Incorporation had been filed on March 3, 1956, by Helen Hoke Associates, Incorporated. It is to be noted that information regarding DOROTHY WILSON was set out previously in this report.

According to the records of the County Court Clerk's Office it was indicated that Helen Hoke Associates, Incorporated, would engage in the business of publishing, manufacturing, printing, buying, selling, and disseminating literary and artistic property through all media, including books, journals, magazines, periodicals, pamphlets, motion picture magazines, motion pictures, radio, television, and any and all other forms of publication, dissemination, and production.

, advised that according to a report dated April 13, 1955, Franklin Watts, Incorporated, Publishers, was incorporated on March 2, 1942. The informant advised that FRANKLIN WATTS is president and treasurer of that corporation and his wife, HELEN WATTS, is vice president and secretary. The corporation publishes juvenile and to a lesser degree trade books.

The current New York Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhattan, New York, contains listings for HELEN WATTS and FRANKLIN WATTS at the address 200 East 66th Street, New York City, both individuals having the same telephone number listing. The telephone directory also lists Franklin Watts, Incorporated, at 699 Madison Avenue, New York, New York.

Miscellaneous

The files of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, which were checked by HELEN PUST on September 4, 1956, contain no record of the employee.

A representative of the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, advised on September 4 and September 20, 1956, no record of the employee, her husband, or her parents was located in the files of that agency.

On September 13, 1956, a representative of the Bureau of Criminal Identification, New York City Police Department, advised his agency files are negative concerning the employee.

Confidential informants, who have furnished reliable information in the past, and who are familiar with general Communist activities in the New York City area, advised on September 6, 11 and 12, 1956, they do not know the employee or her husband.

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
