DeLoach PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION ON THE SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY At 1900 p.m. today, Mr. Katzenbach in the Department gave to us two copies of the report on the assassination by captioned Commission. One copy is attached hereto. Mr. Katzenbach asked that one copy be made available to Mr. Hoover It should be observed that on page 24 under "Conclusions" it is stated: "The Commission has concluded, however, that the FBI took an unduly restrictive view of its role in preventive intelligence work prior to the assassination. A more carefully coordinated treatment of the Oswald case by the FBI might well have resulted in bringing Oswald's activities to the attention of the Secret Service." This conclusion is based on more detailed data contained in Chapter 8 on page 425. Mr. Katzenbach said the Bureau might give consideration as to how inquiries from news media concerning the content of the report might be issued. He has been told the FBI. will "no comment" all inquiries. He said the Department and the FBI has the problem, however, of answering the question, "Has anything been done by the FBI to correct thefault found by the Commission in the above conclusion?"
