Some critics of the Warren Commission report recently have used the film in an attempt to support a theory that more than one rifleman was in-volved in a plot to kill Kennedy.

Texas Gov. John B. Connally, wounded as he sat in front of Kennedy in the presidential limousine as the assassin struck, said Wednesday he disagrees with the theory that the same bullet that apparently passed through Kennedy's neck hit the governor in the back. Connally said he believes he

was wounded by a separate bu-let, not by one that first hit Kennedy. But Connally said he agrees with the Warren Com-mission that Oswald alone did the shooting and sees no rea-son for the investigation to be reopened.
