McGovern Asks Inquiry On Hoover

Sen. George S. McGovern (D.S.D.) said yesterday that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, who begins his 47th year in office today, had violated the Constitution in seeking to discredit a TWA pilot who criticized the FBI's handling of a hijacking case.

McGovern, the only announced candidate for President in 1972, said he had sent documentary evidence of Hoover's alleged illegal actions to Chairman Sam J. Ervin Jr. (D-N.C.) of the Senate Constitutional Rights Subcommittee, whom he asked to conduct a congressional investigation

McGovern said last month that Hoover had written Charles C. Tillinghast Jr., chairman of the board of TWA, to complain about the pilot, Donald C. Cook Jr.
