In his speech, Hoover covered much the same ground as did the FBI's annual report, which was released earlier in the day.

In the report, Hoover said that "Communists have been much encouraged by the current wave of social unrest in the United States." In Civil Rights Protests

"It is a rare civil right activity . . . that does not attract Communists to some degree," he said. "A striking example of this was seen in the riots which erupted in the Harlem area of New York City in July, 1964.

· An all-time high of 1776 violations of the Federal Bank Robbery Statute occurred in fiscal 1965.

· A total of 13,491 fugitives were apprehended, 681 more than in the preceding year. The figure included 18 men who at various times were on the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list.
