 tor J. Edgar Hoover has Knight wrote to Hoover. "But charged the Akron Beacon Journal "distorted" the facts in an article published July 23 that reported the FBI "concluded" the shooting of four Kent State University students by Ohio National Guardsmen last spring was "not necessary and not in order."In a letter to John S. Knight, president and editor of the Beacon Journal, Hoover wrote:
"The results of our inquiry into the Kent State matter were furnished to the United States Department of Justice without recommendation or conclusion. Contrary to the misinformation 'contained in your newspaper, we have made no accustions nor expressed any opinions concern ing prosecutive action to officials of the federal government or the state of Ohio."

Hoover wrote that he had received scores of letters from "knowledgeable and concerned citizens" wanting to know whether the FBI had gone beyond its normal inves tigative role in the Kent case.
He advised Knight that he had replied to public inquiries by calling the article "abso Iutely and unequivocably" false.

In a reply to Hoover's letter, Knight said he regretted the paper had used the word "conclude" instead of "report" but maintained the story was otherwise accurate.
