Report to LBJ Calls Oswald

Hearst Headline Service Special to N. Y. Journal-American WASHINGTON, Nov. 27 .- FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover expects to have his report of the slaying of President Kennedy by Lee Harvey Oswald in President Johnson's hands by Friday at the latest.

The report, it was learned, will eite evidence-some of it unrevealed so far-establishing "beyond reasonable doub!" that Oswald, 24, was the killer of President Kennedy.

Mr. Hoover, who put more than 80 men on the Dallas aspects of the case and acores more in his 55 field offices, will also make these two major points, it was donners

- . There is no evidence thus far to indicate Oswald was ordered to murder President Kennedy by any groups-Communist, Trotskylte or other aubversives.
- . But a raft of Communist literature, letters and other documents, plus Oswald's background and interviews with his acquaintances establish he was philosophically attuned to the violent aspects of the Communist movement. The report will indicate that, if only indirectly, the discipline of Maraism played a part in his murderous action.

Mr. Hoover will also advise the new President, unless a startlink new developement arises before Priday, that Jack Leon Ruby, who shot Oswald to death, was not part of any plot "to seal Oswald a lips "
