He advises that he has served time in Milan, Michigan, and he tries to help the law whenever states that shortly after Martin Luther King, Jr., was shot (April 4, 1968) James Earl Ray was in Mexico, met with some Canadians, and possibly received his Canadian passports while in Mexico. He further advised that he has the satisfaction of knowing he tried to help the law. advised that he reported this matter to our Agent in Quadalajara. It is noted that Martin Luther King, Jr., 3 assassinated on April 4, 1968, and James Earl Ray departed Memphis on April 4, 1968, and arrived in Atlanta on April 5, Ray arrived in Toronto, Canada, on April 8, 1968, applied for a passport on April 16, and was issued this pass-port on April 24, 1968. (Documented by interviews.) Ray departed Toronto on May 6, 1968, arriving in London on May 7, 1968, and immediately left for Lisbon. Ray returned to London on May 17, 1968, and stayed there until he was arrested by New Scotland Yard on June 8, 1968. I am an American Citizen age 73 years old, active and healthy. I thank God and Alcoholics Anonymous for my good health. Am living permantely in Chapala Mexico My income is \$90. 40 Social Security per month. A. A. meets in my home 3 nights per week, 2 meetings in Spanish for Mexicans and 1 meeting per week for Americans. I meet many Ex-Convicts like my self. I served time in Milan Michigan which ended in 1966. I try to help the law when ever it is possible.

Shortly after Martin Luther King was shot, Ray was here and m_{ϕ} met with some Canadians, possibly received his Canadian pasports while here, in Chapala, Mexico. I recognized Ray from his pictures in the papers and other information. Reported same to your Agent at Quadalajara. The next day a Mexican federal Agent called on me, said he looked this man over in a resturant where I had reported seeing him, said he did not think this was Ray as he looked to old, his disguise fooled this man. Ray was not seen anymore in Chapala. He could easily have been captured here, before going to England. I feel that my report to your Agent was ignored, perhaps a few of your men need A. A. "But that is water under the bridge now" I do have the satisfaction of knowing, I tried to help the law.
