The flap over suppression of Oswald's visit to DL FO prior to assassination and leaving a note said to have been threatening; destruction of that note; the FBI's self-investigation of this in 1975; Hooty's untruthfulness and FBI tolerance of it.

Malik and Dallas records

As my prior appeals reflect I regard this as a serious matter. It is of interest to me in my own planned work and writing as well as because of its great historical importance. The more elaborate captioning is also intended to provide an encapsulation prior to consultation with prior appeals.

I am not now rereading these prior appeals but plan to do so soon.

Before the Warren Commission and in the FBI's so-called internal investigation (which was far from an investigation) Hooty testified that he did nothing about the Oswald case because he was awaiting the return of the case from New Orleans, to which it had been transferred, and that this so also was long delayed. I informed you there was reason to believe his explanation was not truthful. It is now, I believe, also clear that Malik was aware of this.

Although they are separated in time by almost a month the two pages both marked 105-32595-54, of 7/17 and 8/15/63 are both from SO and both identify Dallas, not N.O., as Office of Origin. In both records N.O. did this in the captioning, with regard to both Oswalds, and it is written on one, apparently by N.O. SA Milton Kasek. (YIP, he is one of the SAs who resigned rather than accept a transfer as disciplining over this Oswald matter.)

The appear to be N.O. copies sent to FBIHQ. In the copying the N.O. 10-15501 serial numbers are eliminated.

While these records are not the only means by which FBIHQ knew that what the Commission and its own inspectional service were told what is not the truth ( and in fact Inspector Gale was in touch with N.O. SAC as early as 11/25/63, the first working day after the assassination day) I believe they leave no doubt about (a) the untruthfulness and (b) that FBIHQ was witting. Both provide ample motive for the initial suppression and for the continuing withholdings I have appealed.

On 8/21/63 at approximately 10:00 a.m., BILL STUCKEY, who was formerly with one of the New Orleans newspapers, telephonically advised he is no longer with the newspaper but is now connected with the Ross Agency, which is an advertising concern, telephone 529-2274, and also has a Latin American program on WDSU radio.

He advised that within the recent past he had interviewed LEE HARVEY OSWALD and has a 32 minute tape of his interview with OSWALD. He said this interview took place on the night of 8/20/63 and was in connection with OSWALD's claim that he is an officer in the local Fair Play for Cuba Committee. STUCKEY stated that as the FBI was probably aware, OSWALD was recently arrested by the NOPD.

STUCKEY stated his call was for the purpose of determining if the Fair Play for Cuba Committee had been cited as a subversive organization.

I advised STUCKEY I could not furnish him an answer to this question and suggested he contact the Internal Security Section of the U. S. Department of Justice.

STUCKEY stated he appreciated this information and that he would probably call.

Prior to terminating the conversation, STUCKEY mentioned at 6:05 p.m., 8/21/63, OSWALD will appear on a radio program over WDSU which will last for approximately 30 minutes and that this program will be a debate type program. STUCKEY stated he tentatively has Mr. BUTLER of the South-American Alliance lined up to talk with OSWALD.

He said this interview took place on the evening of 8/20/68 and was in connection with OSWALD's claim that he is an officer in the local Fair Play for Cuba Committee. STUCKEY stated that as the FBI was probably aware, OSWALD was recently arrested by the MOBILE.

STUCKEY stated his call was for the purpose of determining if the Fair Play for Cuba Committee has been cited as a subversive organization.

I advised STUCKEY I could not furnish him an answer to this question and suggested he contact the Internal Security Section of the U. S. Department of Justice.

STUCKEY stated he appreciated this information and that he would probably call.

Before terminating the conversation, STUCKEY advised that at 8:05 p.m., 8/21/68, OSWALD was arrested at the address above and that he will be a definite threat to the life of the President of the United States.
