A few days later Supr man told her "forget about that letter."

Horton said "divided" "I'm not doing anything about this, not opening up or it's filing a report on it" Horton had heard the story "All my life assassination" But he thought that was a very capable agent, only he never knew why both had been removed out of Dallas after working the Security Section of the assassination investigation. Shanklin appeared surprised. In 3/75 or 4/75, just before his retirement, Duke used office talk about reports of a new investigation

investigation was "to reconstruct his

Johnson. It was also common knowledge that this note was not placed in Oswald's file and was destroyed."

"His first knowledge" was several days following the assassination of President Kennedy, probably from either St. Edmund D. Ruykema, W. Harlan Brown or Wallace P. Hartman, or maybe St. Richard E. Harrison, General Long, Robert M. Barrett" who was a close personal friend of Lieutenant Jack Ruppel... intelligence, Dallas Police Department, in close contact with Guyon Hasty... The note was discussed at many intervals since that time, but I never heard anyone say they actually read it.
